A KEY TERMS		
1	Moral evil	Actions done by humans, which cause suffering. For example, murder, stealing.
2	Natural evil	Things, which cause suffering but have nothing to do with humans. For example, earthquakes, death.
3	Free will	Humans are free to make their own choices.
4	Morals	Standards of behaviour; principles of right and wrong.
5	Omniscient	God is all-knowing.
6	Omnipotent	God is all-powerful
7	Omnibenevolent	God is all-loving
8	Genesis	The first book of the Bible.
9	Stewardship	God put Adam and Even in the garden of Eden to act as stewards and take of it.
10	Holocaust (Shoah)	The World War II genocide of the European Jews. Between 1941 and 1945. The killing of six million Jews and millions of others by Nazi Germany.

B ADAM & EVE		
1	Adam	First man created by God on day 6 in the Garden of Eden. Made from mud.
2	Eve	Made from Adam's rib to be his companion.
3	Serpent	Satan disguised as a snake.
4	Story of The Fall	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • God created a perfect world • The serpent persuaded Eve to eat the fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil • Adam and Eve chose to disobey God • This led to evil and suffering, the Original Sin against God • God warned them that if they ate from the forbidden tree they would die • Adam and Eve were punished and had to leave the Garden of Eden.

C THE HOLOCAUST		
1	Auschwitz	First killing centre during WWII where the largest numbers of European Jews were murdered.
2	Maximillian Kolbe	Kolbe, Polish priest died as a prisoner in Auschwitz, on August 14, 1941. When a prisoner escaped from the camp, the Nazis selected 10 others to be killed by starvation in reprisal for the escape. One of the selected to die began to cry: "My wife, my children I will never see them again!" Kolbe stepped forward and asked to die in his place. His request was granted.
3	Sir Nicholas Winton	Winton was a British humanitarian worker who organised and supervised the rescue of 669 children, most of them Jewish, from Czechoslovakia on the eve of World War II. Winton found homes for the children and arranged for their safe passage to Britain.
