A JESUS

1	Jesus	Son of God, part of the Trinity.
2	Incarnation	Embodied into flesh.
3	Bethlehem	A city where Jesus was born.
4	Jerusalem	A city where Jesus died.
5	Trade	Jesus was a carpenter.
6	Disciple	Follower of Jesus. Jesus had 12 disciples.
7	Judas	Jesus was betrayed by Judas, one of Jesus' disciples.
8	Parables	A story used to tell a moral, spiritual or religious lesson. An example of Jesus' parables are The Good Samaritan.

B CHRISTIAN WORSHIP

1	Church	Building where Christians worship and can be used for other activities and events within the local community.
2	Worship	Expression of feelings towards God.
3	Prayers	Communication with God.

C FEATURES OF A CHURCH

1	Altar or communion table	This is at the eastern end of the church and is often the focal point of worship. Holy communion is received here.
2	Organ	Provides background to the singing.
3	Pulpit	A raised platform where the priest will preach his sermon.
4	Pews	These are wooden benches on which worshippers sit.

5	Font	Used for baptism, this often near the door to symbolise that baptism marks entry into the Christian Church.
6	Lectern	Where the Bible is read. It is often made of brass and in the shape of an eagle. This symbolises the Word of God being spread worldwide.
7	Confessional	This is found in Roman Catholic and some Anglican churches. This is a place where people can confess their sins to a priest and receive forgiveness.

D CHURCHES CAN ALSO BE USED FOR...

1	Youth and community groups	Brownies, scouts, mother and toddler groups.
2	Celebrate festivals	At Christmas they might have a Christmas dinner or hold a nativity play in the build-up to Christmas.
3	Concerts	Musicians or singers perform special religious pieces of music.
4	Sunday school	Learn about Christianity and the Bible in different ways.
5	Food banks	Support the local community during difficult times.
